Approximately a week or two prior to the incident of September 29, 2014, Mrs. Rush returned to work and performed her normal duties. On the date her paycheck it was not properly processed. . It was arranged that on Monday, September 29, 2014, on her day off from work, she would come by the Human Resources Department and would receive a check. She arrived on site at approximately 6:00 p.m. Mrs. Rush went into the HR department and took a seat in front of an Amazon employee working for the HR department. Unfortunately, Mrs. Rush does not know the woman's name and is identified herein as DOE 1.

After speaking for about 15 minutes, Mrs. Rush was feeling uncomfortable because her fetus was moving. Mrs. Rush stood up, faced towards the wall and away from the room, and stretched her arms and back. In doing so, Mrs. Rush's shirt lifted up over her pregnant abdomen thereby exposing her pants and the fact that her pants were not buttoned and could not be buttoned at the front due to her advanced stage of pregnancy. At that moment, DOE 1, chastised Mrs. Rush for her pants being open at the front and indicated that this was inappropriate at the facility. At this point, DOE 1 told Mrs. Rush that she was going to fix her pants and took an industrial duty rubber band, wrapped it between the two edges of the open pants, and cinched it tight to close the gap. Mrs. Rush was shocked by the action but was submissive because she was within her employer's place of business.

For the next forty-five minutes, Mrs. Rush was required to sit and wait in the HR department for a person to issue the paycheck. While sitting and waiting, Mrs. Rush could feel the waistband of the pants was gathered tight across her pregnant belly and she could feel her child kicking initially following the tightening of the rubber band. Frustrated with waiting and being advised that the check could not be ready that evening, Mrs. Rush left the facility to rejoin her mother who was waiting outside in the car during the hour and thirty minutes Mrs. Rush was in the building.

2 As soon as Mrs. Rush got out of the building and was walking to her mother's car, she attempted to
3 remove the rubber band, however, because the rubber band was so tight and so heavy, she did not
4 have the strength to remove it. Her mother secured some fingernail clippers and finally clipped the
5 rubber band off. Mrs. Rush recalls seeing marks of the waistband around her mid-section once the
6 pants came loose. She also recalls, that from near the end of the time she was in HR, and thereafter,
7 she never felt the baby move again.

8 That evening, concerned, yet hoping that the baby was merely asleep, Mrs. Rush rubbed her
9 pregnant belly, took a bath and remained awake during the night. By 5:30 a.m., on September 30,
10 2014, Mrs. Rush was very concerned because she had not felt the baby move for about the last 10
11 hours. She contacted her insurance company and her physician and was instructed by both to
12 immediately go to the hospital emergency room. Mrs. Rush's doctor met her and her husband at the
13 hospital. An ultrasound was performed and the baby was found to be dead. Her doctor was shocked
14 since at the last visit, which was less than a week prior, the baby was perfectly healthy and well
15 developed. Mrs. Rush was induced to deliver her still born son. He was born on October 1, 2014.

16 Upon the delivery of the now deceased baby boy, the child was born with his eyes and mouth
17 wide open as if the baby was screaming in terror. His face was fully discolored from the color of
18 his body. There was no cord around the neck of the infant and the placenta was properly intact.

19 Due to the sudden lack of movement following the placement of the rubber band on Mrs.
20 Rush's pants and the otherwise unexplained death of the child, it is concluded that the unsolicited,
21 unnecessary and inappropriate actions of DOE 1, in taking it upon herself to cinch tight Mrs. Rush's
22 pants, caused causing the death of Plaintiff's fetus. Plaintiff suffered severe emotional stress,
23 depression, distress and loss due to the actions of DOE 1, in her capacity as an employee of
24 Defendant AMAZON.COM.

This touching by DOE 1 was unwanted, unconsented to, and harmful to Plaintiff. As a direct and proximate result of this improper and harmful touching of Plaintiff, Plaintiff's fetus died. Plaintiff suffered severe emotional distress and has incurred medical expenses.

Plaintiff seeks damages for the alleged assault and battery in a sum according to proof at trial. Plaintiff seeks for damages by way of exemplary damages due to the intentional and improper conduct of DOE 1.

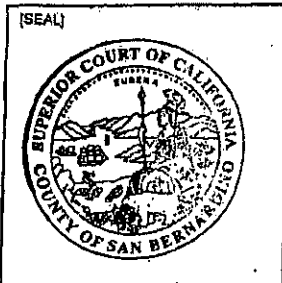




