ORDER

This is a preliminary injunction appeal. Appellants' motion to amend the briefing schedule is granted in part. The briefing schedule is amended as follows: the opening brief and excerpts of record are now due November 29, 2010; the answering brief is due December 27, 2010 or 28 days after service of the opening brief, whichever is earlier; and the optional reply brief is due within 14 days after service of the answering brief. *See* 9th Cir. R. 3-3(b).

If appellants fail to file timely the opening brief, this appeal will be dismissed automatically by the Clerk for failure to prosecute. *See* 9th Cir. R. 42-1.

If the United States Supreme Court grants the petition for writ of certiorari, appellants can again seek a stay of proceedings at that time.
