The universal plight of private higher education is lack of funds. The law schools are not immune to this problem, and the difficulty has been aggravated by the boom in law school enrollment and accompanying growth of support facilities. The LAWYER operates at a loss which is offset, but not overcome, by direct university support, subscription income, and advertising. By far the largest portion of our budget is supplied by the university, and that support is necessarily limited by other university requirements. If the LAWYER is to continue to grow without sacrificing quality, another source of income must be found to supplement present resources. The members of the legal community listed opposite are the forerunners of what we hope will be an increasing trend toward professional support of the law review.
